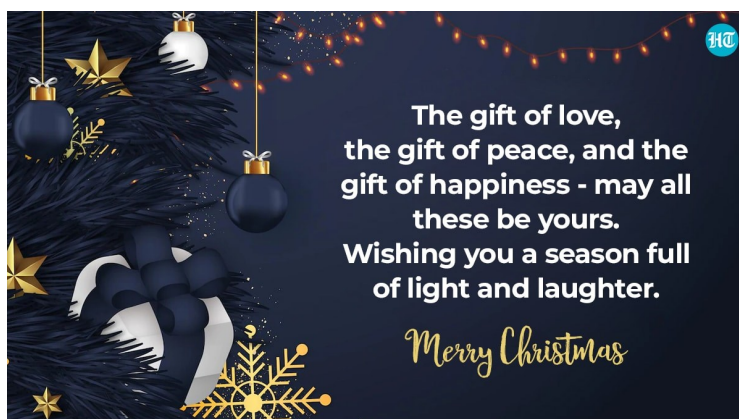
We will bring music to Landis Adult Day Services in many different ways this month. We hope returning to some of those memories bring joy and light!

Visitor and Resident/Client Code of Mutual Respect

Residents/Clients and team members of Landis Communities strive to honor and uphold the organization's faith-based traditions and values, which are founded in Christ-Like love. Together we commit ourselves to be honest, sincere, trustworthy, and accountable in relationships, communication and decision-making, and, with mutual respect, value the diversity of each individual. Our intention is to create a safe place to work and live striving for a peaceful resolution when concerns arise.

We commit to these values as we honor God in our service to others.

Behaviors contrary to these beliefs will not be tolerated. These include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Any violent or aggressive verbal communication or behavior, including physical or verbal threats, assault, or the infliction of bodily harm, throwing objects and/or destroying property.
2. Messages that harass or threaten others.
3. Yelling, using profanity, name calling, or other actions that are disruptive.
4. Physically preventing team members from performing their job, including disrespecting the physical boundaries of others.
5. Engaging in sexual offenses including indecent exposure, inappropriate sexual advances (physical or verbal), or contributing to a sexually harassing environment.
6. Refusal to follow community policies, including resident or client safety and care protocols.
7. Making offensive, disrespectful, or discriminatory comments about others' race, accent, age, religion, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, or other personal traits. Or refusing to interact with individuals based on these traits.
8. Photographing and/or recording anyone without their expressed permission.
9. Visitors using or being under the influence of illegal drugs or alcohol.
10. Visitors who possess firearms, or other weapons on their person.

Anyone believed to have violated the Code of Mutual Respect with unwelcome words or actions will be given the chance to respectfully explain their point of view or actions. Residents or clients who violate this code may be asked to make, with reasonable notice, other plans for their care or housing. Visitors who violate this Code of Mutual Respect will be subject to removal from the household, service area, or entire campus and have visitation limited temporarily or permanently. Team members are expected to adhere to similar behavioral standards as outlined above.
